

Conestoga Township B.O.S Minutes

February 6th, 2018

CALL TO ORDER- The Supervisors meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Berry.

PRESENT- Supervisors, John Berry, Chas. Timothy Byers, and William Rankin, Secretary Naomi Little, Citizens; Attendance list attached.

MINUTES- The Supervisors approved the January meeting minutes on a motion by Rankin, second by Byers. All in favor none opposed.

The Special meeting minutes for January 19th were approved on a motion by Byers, second by Rankin. All in favor none opposed.

BILLS- The Supervisors approved all bills paid during the month of January on a motion by Byers, second by Rankin. All in favor none opposed.

TREASURER'S / ZONING & STATE POLICE REPORT - On file at office for review.

GENERAL PUBLIC

Robin Maquire asked on why the public comment was put at the beginning of the meeting. The Twp. Solicitor, Dan Becker, explained that by having public comment at the beginning it would give the Residents an opportunity to make comments on the items of business before they take action on them.

Lieutenant Brandon J. Daniels from Pennsylvania State Police Troop J presented the police report for January. Daniels will be the liaison for the Township and he will send a report monthly to the Township. Any concerns will be sent to Daniels for him to pass on to the proper division.

Robin Maquire inquired about the pipeline workers speeding. Lieutenant Daniels said that any complaints need to be sent to the State Police so that they may investigate the issue.

Larry Frankford commented about Robin Maquire stopping traffic on Main Street which is creating a traffic issue.

Berry stated to Robin Maquire that he is getting complaints about her causing issues on the roads. He said that Residents are calling him about her u turning on Main Street, pulling out in front of Williams's trucks, swerving at flaggers, parking on hills, filming on Sickman's Mill campground, and blocking traffic.

Robin stated that she is careful with what she does and if she stops she if off the road, but that one time she was not.

Robin said she uses an escort flag to direct Williams trucks that she believes should have an escort, Lieutenant Daniels stated that the State Police are out enforcing the laws and if there is an issue with Residents seeing Williams doing something they shouldn't then Residents should call the State Police, because if the State Police get there and someone is out trying to enforce laws on their own then they will be cited also.

Lieutenant Daniels said that the State Police truck inspectors have reviewed the Williams trucks and that they have found them to be in compliance. If anyone believes there is an issue with Williams they should contact the State Police so that they can investigate it.

Berry asked for Robin Maquire to cease with these actions before someone gets hurt.

Ben Vonderheide asked the status on the SRPD investigation. Lieutenant Daniels stated that the investigation was referred to their agency; they are not handling the investigation out of the Lancaster barracks. It is being investigated by their department through their Bureau of Criminal Investigation Division.

Doris Warfel asked why the Conestoga ambulance is not being seen much in the Township. Byers stated that he did ask about that and it was a verbal contract and unfortunately it doesn't hold since it is not in the agreement.

Doris Warfel and Kathy Sangary asked where the money will go that is made off of the car show, since it is in Conestoga they feel that the Fire Department should get more of the proceeds. Joel Herzog said the money will be split with the Police and the Fire Department as before and they have not come up with a different percentage. Larry Frankford said that he thinks they should have the Car Show the same as it has been and then evaluate it as it goes. He feels the Car Show is good for the community and that is what is most important and the Board also agreed.

OLD BUSINESS

RESOLUTION 2018-06- This Resolution was to reduce the Township's millage rate from 1.1 to .871. Approved on a motion by Rankin, second by Byers. All in favor none opposed.

AMBULANCE CONTRACT UPDATE- Byers informed the Residents about information Residents were asking about with ambulance services. Susquehanna Valley EMS will be getting information to the Township to clarify what Ambulance Members will need to do to get reimbursement. Also what services Susquehanna will be able to provide. Byers said he will be getting more information in the near future so that the Board will be able to move forward.

NEW BUSINESS:

CAR SHOW- Joel Herzog presented the Board with information on the Car Show for 2018. The show would be on September 22 from 8-4. Approved on a motion by Berry, second by Rankin. All in favor none opposed.

857 STEHMAN ROAD- Relocation of a property line for Daniel and Mary Hershey was approved on a motion by Berry, second by Byers. All in favor none opposed.

BOB HERSHEY JR.- Hershey Jr. made a presentation on some ideas he would like to proceed with on his property at 647 Sand Hill Rd. The Board wishes him the best on his endeavors and believes the family fun farm would be a great activity for the youth.
