

# *Conestoga Township B.O.S Minutes*

CALL TO ORDER- The Supervisors meeting was called to order at 7pm by Berry.

PRESENT- Supervisors, John Berry, Robert Hershey Jr. and William Rankin, Secretary Naomi Little, Citizens; Attendance list attached.

Berry stated we are looking forward to possibly putting bids out for the Trail in 2020.

The Board wanted to extend appreciation and thanks to the following people for helping out and providing assistance when needed to the Township.

Leroy Eshleman for helping with cleaning up the Rail Trail, Bull -Paul Spangler for always helping out with welding projects, Mike Rankin for donating a new roof for the shop, Greg Hess for helping to tree trim at the pool, Denny Weber donating some time for painting at the pool, and Parke Rineer for helping with any equipment repairs.

**Robin Maquire** asked why the Twp. would not allow for vehicles to travel down to the preserve and she is concerned about people getting to the preserve without the option to drive down. The Board explained that there is a lot of damage due to 4 wheeling and trash dumping so gating the area will help stop the damage and the trail will still be accessible to walk to from the parking area. The Conservancy will also provide assistance to make the area available to the disabled.

**Leroy Eshleman** stated that he thinks the gates will help with stopping the vandalism from 4 wheeling and trash dumping.

**Judy Stoner** asked if both ends of the road will be gated, the Board stated that it will be gated on both ends.
