

Conestoga Township Board of Supervisors Minutes

February 6, 2024

BOS Meeting called to order at 7:00pm by Matthew Connelly.

Present: Chairman Matthew Connelly; Vice Chairman Joe Devoy

Minutes: Supervisors approved the January 2, 2024 BOS Minutes motion by Joe Devoy and a second Matthew Connelly. All in favor. None opposed.

Bills: The Supervisors approved the bills to be paid for the month of February 2024. Motion made by Joe Devoy and a second by Matthew Connelly. All in favor. None opposed.

General Public

Matthew Connelly: Stated an executive session happened on 1/22/24, 2/3/24, 2/5/24.

Joe Devoy: Stated that he is excited to be back and asked for the community's continued support.

Matthew Connelly: Opened the floor for public comment.

Christine Connelly: Stated that Brandi Tomasetti claimed that she was still employed as the Conestoga Township Secretary/Treasurer when she ran for the Senatorial bid and was curious as to her position in Conestoga Township.

Joe Devoy: Stated that it will be addressed later in the meeting.

Ron Wescott: Stated that he has an issue with runoff and provided pictures.

Joe Devoy: Stated he and Leroy Eshleman, of the Road Crew, can help him after the meeting.

Personnel

Matthew Connelly: Stated that Brandi Tomasetti had sent a resignation letter and the Supervisors accepted it. Further, stated; Brandi claimed harassment from John Berry. John Berry claimed Brandi Tomasetti was insubordinate. Upon speaking lawyer and weighing t, Matthew Connelly and Joe Devoy were advised by the lawyer to reach a settlement with Brandi; to which Mw and Joe agreed.

Resident: Asked if Brandi Tomasetti was suing the Township.

Matthew Connelly: Replied, "No."

Joe Devoy: Stated Brandi is receiving a financial resolution in lieu of suing the Township.

Resident: Asked: "Why was she going to sue the Township?"

Joe Devoy: Stated she was suing the Township because she had harassment claims against John Berry.

Melanie Scheid: Stated that the Township should hire a man as the next Secretary.

Attendees: Erupted with laughter.

Resident: “Does the Township have liability insurance?”

Joe Devoy: Replied, we have insurance but the lawyers said it does not cover in this case.

Resident: Asked what was the name of the other Supervisor.

Joe Devoy: Replied; John Berry who is the other Supervisor and Roadmaster.

Joe Geesey: Asked if there were any details on the settlement; dollar-wise or was that all privy?

Joe Devoy: Replied if you file a Right-To- Know (RTK) you will be able to see the settlement.

Resident: Inquired if the other three settlements are public knowledge.

Joe Devoy: Stated that if you do file a RTK you would be entitled to see a copy of the settlement and it is public knowledge but he was not aware of the previous settlements.

Settlement Resignation of Brandi Tomasetti

Matthew Connelly: “Do I hear a Motion to ratify the execution of the settlement resignation with Brandi Tomasetti?”

Joe Devoy: Motioned to ratify the settlement resignation agreement with Brandi Tomasetti. Seconded by **Matthew Connelly**. All in favor. None opposed.

Treasurer and Right-To-Know Officer

Joe Devoy: Stated that Brandi Tomasetti was the Treasurer and RTK Officer; because Joe is the Assistant Treasurer, Matthew Connelly is going to take on the Treasurer role. Matthew has been working on RTK information in Brandi’s absence and had volunteered to take on that position.

Joe Devoy: Asked if there were any comments before it was ratified?

Joe Devoy: Motioned to make Matthew Connelly the Conestoga Township Treasurer.

Matthew Connelly: Seconded the Motion and made a Motion to appoint himself as Treasurer.

Joe Devoy: Seconded the motion. All in favor. None opposed.

Joe Devoy: Made a Motion to make Matthew Connelly the RTK Officer of Conestoga Township. Seconded by Matthew Connelly. All in favor. None opposed.

New Secretary Posting

Joe Devoy: Stated there will be a posting for a new Township Secretary. He emphasized that they will be taking their time to hire the right person. He and Matthew Connelly will prevent what happened in the past, even if it takes six months. They are determined to hire the right person to do a great job for the long haul. He asked the residents to spread the word and it would be better if they were local. The position will be on the Conestoga FB, and the Conestoga Township web site.

Matthew Connelly: Asked if there was a motion to advertise the Conestoga Township’s Secretary position.

Joe Devoy: Made a motion to advertise the Conestoga Township’s Secretary position.

It was seconded by Matthew Connelly. All in favor. None opposed.

Conestoga Township Interim Secretary

Matthew Connelly: Introduced Michele Lovett as the interim part-time Secretary until someone is secured for the full-time position. He announced that Michele will be able to assist residents at the office: Tuesday – Thursday 9:00am-3:00pm.

Michele Lovett: Stood to her feet and gave a brief greeting.

Matthew Connelly: Asked if there was a Motion to ratify the hiring of Michele Lovett on January 25, 2024?

Joe Devoy: Made a Motion to hire Michele Lovett on January 25, 2024 and seconded by Matthew Connelly. All in favor. None opposed.

Road Crew Employee CDL Training

Matthew Connelly: Applauded Leroy Eshleman, Barry Rankin, Bob Barton, and Collin Deihm for their skillful ploughing and keeping roadways clear of ice and snow. He emphasized the necessary CDL training of Collin Deihm so he can operate the trucks and ploughs.

Matthew Connelly: Asked if there was a motion to authorize execution of the CDL training for Collin Deihm.

Joe Devoy: Made a motion and it was seconded by Matthew Connelly. All in favor. None opposed.

Authorization of New Check Signer

Matthew Connelly: Stated that we need a new check signer; in order to go forward, we need to authorize Joe Devoy as a new check signer unless there was an objection.

Joe Devoy: Informed that the bank cannot change the check signer until it is made known publicly and shown in the Minutes.

Matthew Connelly: Made a Motion to the execution of making Joe Devoy a check signer. This was seconded by Joe Devoy. All in favor. None opposed.

NEW BUSINESS

Matthew Connelly: Introduction of Live Stream Meetings

Dave Clancy: Stated that it would be beneficial for those who cannot attend the meetings to have access through Live Stream. He suggested a user-friendly, low-cost system. He opened the discussion to any media knowledgeable residents.

Joe Devoy: Stated that after speaking with the lawyer, he was advised not to do it; but it is the Township's decision. Joe is in favor of it and asked if the resident's opinions. He asked for any volunteers.

Christine Connelly: Stated that she objected to the idea if live streaming because it is important for residents to attend the meetings and see for themselves what is going on. She gave an example that when we vote, we must vote in person. There is an alternative to voting. She asked how many other townships live stream?

Joe Devoy: Stated for clarification, that people will not be able to participate but simply listen. If you cannot attend the meetings, there will be copy on YouTube.

Resident: Asked why the Solicitor did not advise that?

Joe Devoy: Replied, "Because he is a Solicitor." It is tradition and how things were always done. Whatever the Minutes read, that's what they are, and cannot be altered.

Matthew Connelly: Stated residents have the right to record meetings.

Resident: Stated, maybe, instead of live streaming, we should record and have it looked at and then posted.

Carol Clancy: Offered the opposite. Live stream meetings but don't record it. Therefore, there is no record. The issue is having an existing record which is usually the concerns of the attorney.

Christine Connelly: Stated that she views it as a security risk. She emphasized that we are a million-dollar Township with limited funds. Security is huge to her.

Pat Brogan: Stated that the city has a YouTube channel that works pretty well. It was started because a citizen came in and taped the meetings and put it on YouTube and anybody can do that. She said it is a way to communicate for folks who cannot attend a meeting. It's about transparency.

Don Connelly: Presented two questions:

1. How many other Townships live stream?
2. Is it necessary to place the responsibility on the Township and Supervisors when the public can record the meetings?

Matthew Connelly: Stated that he would research the other Townships.

Joe Devoy: Asked if anyone would volunteer to record next month's meeting.

Don Connelly: Stated that the Supervisors are not required to record meetings but to hold meetings; that is the requirement.

Christine Connelly: Her concern was Artificial Intelligence (AI) and that anyone could alter the recordings and change it to what they wanted said instead of what was actually said. Plus, we do not have the funds to do this.

Dave Clancy: Volunteered to research the cost. He said he would look into square footage and the approximate location.

Robin Maguire: Stated that she live streams and has never been in trouble.

Joe Devoy: Stated that Robin had the right to do that and that she is not in trouble.

Aiden Devoy: Stated the live stream would be free. Simple as setting up an iPhone in the back of the room.

Matthew Connelly: Stated that this subject will continue in next month's meeting.

Matthew Connelly Introduced Annual Fire Chief Report

Larry Frankford: Stated there were 25 fire calls, 20 medical calls, 42 assists, 24 vehicle accidents, 80 public services, 54 control burns, 5 automatic alarms, 18 boat calls for a total of 268 calls. They hauled 94,100 gallons of water mostly for cisterns. Total hours were 1889.5 hours.

Trainings: 25 Company level trainings at 417-man hours, 26 outside fire hall trainings for 43 people at 359 hours. 30 sessions of driver training. 545 Personnel with a total of 89 trainings, total man hours = 1,352.75.

There was a new tanker ordered last year. Chassis came in and will sit till this fall. The new truck will cost around \$650,000. Chassis cost around \$200,000 and it is paid in full. There will be a \$250,000 loan that will be taken out for the body. This will be a bigger truck with a bigger pump to better serve the community.

Paul Thomas stepped down as Chief and had served since 1929.

Troy Bresch was Deputy Chief and he stepped down. He thanked these men for the dedicated years of service. Mark Mitchell is the new Deputy and Preston Harsh as the Assistant Chief.

Fundraiser: Dance at Millersville VFW on March 2, 2024

We appreciate your support as they have 275 tickets to sell.

Joe Devoy: Appreciated the Conestoga Township Volunteer Fire Company to provide us with safety and they have the Supervisors 100% support.

Matthew Connelly Introduced the Classic Car Show

Rich Graham: This is the 11th year minus the COVID19 year.

Date: September 28, 2024

Time: 9:00am-3:00pm. Road closed 8:00am-4:00pm.

Matthew Connelly: Asked if there was a rain date.

Rich Graham: Relied there is no rain date. There are 300-325 cars.

Don Connelly: Asked if they could go to Sand Hill Road and that there could be a rain date.

Rich Graham: The main thing is to be close to the fire company for food.

Matthew Connelly: Made a Motion to the closure of Main Street on September 28, 2024 from 8:00am-4:00pm. This was seconded by Joe Devoy. All in favor. None opposed.

Melanie Scheid: Before we adjourn, asked about John Berry.

Joe Devoy: Stated they are going through the options. He had no say in the settlement. He knows there were allegations and we will report back in March.

Melanie Scheid: Asked if John Berry was being paid full or disability.

Joe Devoy: Stated that Disability is filed. He is getting paid sick leave. Joe then, asked Terry Shepps from the Shepps Group CPA if this was correct.

Terry Shepps: Replied, "That is correct."

Melanie Scheid: Asked if he can miss as many meetings as he wants as Supervisor.

Joe Devoy: Stated that the Supervisors have zero power. The only way to remove John Berry would be an impeachment process which is very expensive. As Roadmaster, Matthew Connelly and Joe Devoy can remove him from that position.

Joe Devoy: Motioned to adjourn and it was seconded by Matthew Connelly. All in favor. None opposed.
